2. Support Holistic Development

3. Provide Comprehensive Assessments

Our assessment process includes:

- **Baseline Assessments**: Within the first six weeks of enrollment, children undergo a baseline assessment to evaluate their progress in the 17 areas of learning. Results are recorded in baseline assessment sheets, forming the basis for future planning.
- Ongoing Assessments: We implement continuous assessments in core subjects such as English, Mathematics, Arabic, and Science. Teachers gather evidence through daily observations, classwork, and homework to inform their teaching strategies.

- **Formative Assessments:** These are ongoing evaluations that take place during daily activities and interactions. They involve observing children while they play, take part in group activities, and complete various tasks to gain insights into their progress and learning requirements.
- Summative Assessments: These assessments are carried out at the end of a defined period, such as a term or academic year, to assess overall development. They usually involve reviewing children's portfolios, completed work, and key learning milestones.
- **Standardized Assessments:** These are tools designed to evaluate children's development against age-specific benchmarks. Examples include tests for language, literacy, and numeracy skills that offer comparative insights.

4. Promote Parent Engagement

Establishing open lines of communication between Bedford Kindergarten and parents is crucial. We ensure parents are informed and actively involved in their child's learning journey through:

- **Regular Updates**: We share progress reports three times a year for KG1 and KG2 students, providing a comprehensive view of each child's development.
- Formal Parent-Teacher Meetings: Scheduled three times a year, these meetings allow parents to discuss their child's progress and set future targets. Additional meetings can be arranged by appointment for more individualized discussions.
